



Scribeasy: Productivity and Enjoyment Increased

Testing with Sample: 85 children from Years 1, 4, 5 and 6 state school 8% of users (100% were boys) said they don't like to write

TOOLS THAT WORK

Typing with Scribeasy: 90% said enjoyed.

Making a picture: 80% said it helped them build an idea.

90% used the thesaurus and said it encouraged them to use more words.

FROM WORRIED TO PROUD

How engagement increased: 30% of the users were worried about writing a story before the session progressed to feeling 80% happy, and two thirds of the group were 'very proud' with what they wrote that day.


Scribeasy works with older boys

- Those who reported feeling "Worried" when asked to tell a story but went on to be "Proud" reading out their stories were mostly boys (80%) and mostly in Year 6 (93%)
 - Year 6 boys explaining why they felt "Worried" when asked to tell a story:
 - "Because I was thinking that mine might not be good"
 - "This is because I panic quickly and forget the story"
 - "Because I don't really like reading"
 - "Because I don't get a lot of ideas"
 - "Because I'm not good at English"
 - "Because I'm not good at stories so I will feel a bit uncomfortable"
 - "Because I don't know what to write"
 - When asked whether they like to write, 7 out of 89 children answered "No" all were boys and there was a very significant overlap with the 9 children who reported not writing at home with parents
 - Of those 7 boys who said they didn't like to write, 6 said they had "Enjoyed" typing their Scribeasy story (1 "Not Sure")





Scribeasy takes children from "Worried" to "Proud"






